CAAB's proposed charging scheme

The Civil Aviation Authority of The Bahamas (CAAB) published on the 31st August 2020 the Notice of Intent describing the CAAB's intention to implement a charging scheme for air navigation services (ANS) and regulatory oversight activities. This Notice of Intent was publicly disseminated and it is available on the CAAB's website www.bcaabahamas.com.

CAAB's consultation meeting

The CAAB hereby convenes a Consultation Meeting open to all the airspace users in compliance with ICAO's Doc 9082. The CAAB will give adequate information to users relating to the proposed charging scheme and also proper consideration to the views of users and the effect the charges may have on them.

The Consultation Meeting is scheduled for the Wednesday, 18th November 2020 at 12.00 EST. The meeting will proceed with the following program:

- 12.00-12.30: The CAAB will introduce the proposed charging scheme.
- 12.30-14.00: Questions and answers from the audience.
